This can be caused by a natural event, such as a lightning strike, or by man-made means, such as a nuclear explosion blast. If you're concerned about the possibility of an EMP attack, it's important to know what will and won't survive it.

The first burst, E1, can destroy solar panels and other electronics. Later bursts, E2 and E3, could cause even more damage.
