What is compressed air energy storage (CAES)?

Compressed air energy storage (CAES) is an effective solution for balancing this mismatch and therefore is suitable for use in future electrical systems to achieve a high penetration of renewable energy generation.

Could compressed-air energy storage be a useful inter-seasonal storage resource?

Compressed-air energy storage could be a useful inter-seasonal storage resource to support highly renewable power systems. This study presents a modelling approach to assess the potential for such storage in porous rocks and, applying it to the UK, finds availability of up to 96 TWh in offshore saline aquifers.

Where can compressed air energy be stored?

The number of sites available for compressed air energy storage is higher compared to those of pumped hydro [1]. Porous rocks and cavern reservoirs are also ideal storage sites for CAES. Gas storage locations are capable of being used as sites for storage of compressed air.

How much does compressed-air energy storage cost in the UK?

This UK storage potential is achievable at costs in the range US\$0.42-4.71 kWh<sup>-1</sup>. Compressed-air energy storage could be a useful inter-seasonal storage resource to support highly renewable power systems.

Can a pumped hydro compressed air energy storage system operate under near-isothermal conditions?

Chen, et al. designed and analysed a pumped hydro compressed air energy storage system (PH-CAES) and determined that the PH-CAES was capable of operating under near-isothermal conditions, with the polytropic exponent of air = 1.07 and 1.03 for power generation and energy storage, respectively, and a roundtrip efficiency of 51%.

What is a compressed air storage system?

The compressed air storages built above the ground are designed from steel. These types of storage systems can be installed everywhere, and they also tend to produce a higher energy density. The initial capital cost for above-ground storage systems are very high.
