Which planets are based on their distance from the Sun?

The planets in order from the Sun based on their distance are Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune. The planets of our Solar System are listed based on their distance from the Sun. There are, of course, the dwarf planets Ceres, Pluto, Haumea, Makemake, and Eris; however, they are in a different class.

How many planets are in orbit around the Sun?

There are no longer nine planets in orbit around the Sun, but rather, there are now eight. After 2006, Pluto was no longer considered a planet by the astronomical community. While Earth literally does exist in a vacuum, our eight planetary neighbors ensure that astronomers possess the opportunity to decipher our world's place in the universe.

What are the first 4 planets from the Sun?

The first four planets from the Sun are Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars. These inner planets also are known as terrestrial planets because they have solid surfaces. Mercury is the smallest planet in our solar system, and the nearest to the Sun. Venus is the second planet from the Sun, and Earth's closest planetary neighbor.

The sun (which, incidentally, is only a medium-size star) is larger than any of the planets in our solar system. Its diameter is 1,392,000 kilometers (864,949 miles). Earth's diameter is only 12,756 kilometers (7,926 miles) -- meaning more than one million Earths could fit ...

Pluto is by far the most famous dwarf planet. Discovered by Clyde Tombaugh in 1930, Pluto was long considered our solar system's ninth planet. But after other astronomers found similar intriguing worlds deeper in the distant Kuiper Belt - the IAU reclassified Pluto as a ...
