



Lithium battery disposal sites

Where can I drop off a used lithium ion battery?

Instead, EPA recommends that all household lithium batteries be dropped off at battery collection sites (e.g., often located at electronics retailers) or household hazardous waste collection facilities for proper management. The EPA Used Lithium-Ion Batteries web page offers resources to find a battery recycling location near you.

How do you dispose of lithium batteries?

To dispose of lithium batteries, you'll need to take them to a recycling center, which is easy to find online. Keep batteries out of your regular recycling bin. Household batteries are recycled separately from other items. Mixing batteries in with other recyclables can result in a fire, as the battery can spark.

Can you put lithium batteries in the trash?

Unlike alkaline batteries, lithium batteries are reactive and contain hazardous materials. For this reason, you should not put them in the trash. To dispose of lithium batteries, you'll need to take them to a recycling center, which is easy to find online. Keep batteries out of your regular recycling bin.

How do you store used lithium batteries?

Store the batteries in a cool, dry place until disposal. It's best to avoid extreme temperatures, since batteries can be reactive. Similarly, it's best to keep the batteries dry. Place your used lithium batteries in a pantry, cabinet, or closet. Take your battery to the collection site.

Can lithium ion batteries be recycled?

Lithium-ion batteries and devices containing these batteries should NOT go in household garbage or recycling bins. Lithium-ion batteries SHOULD be taken to separate recycling or household hazardous waste collection points. To prevent fires, tape battery terminals and/or place lithium-ion batteries in separate plastic bags.

Where can I recycle Li-ion batteries?

Li-ion batteries in electronics: Send electronic devices containing Li-ion batteries to certified electronics recyclers, participating retailers and recyclers in electronics takeback services or contact your local solid waste or household hazardous waste collection program for more options.

Battery Recycling Location. Where you can recycle batteries will vary depending on your location and state and local laws for disposal of batteries. Single-use batteries are more difficult to recycle than rechargeable

Check for the word "lithium" marked on the battery. Do not put button-cell, coin, or lithium single-use batteries . in the trash or municipal recycling bins. Check with . Earth 911 to find a recycling location near you. Lithium. These common batteries are made with lithium : Single-Use (Li) metal and are non-rechargeable.

Non-rechargeable and alkaline household batteries may be discarded with regular trash. However, it is illegal to put rechargeable batteries in your trash or recycling. This includes batteries from laptops, cell phones, and digital cameras. If you need to get rid of rechargeable batteries, you can: Drop them off at a Special Waste Disposal site

More uses out of one battery means fewer batteries to dispose in the long run. Disposal. Tape the ends of the "dead" battery. If a metal object touches the two posts of a 9-volt battery, or comes in contact with more than one regular battery, it can cause a short circuit which can make enough heat to start a fire.

Proper disposal of common household batteries: Drop off household batteries at a temporary Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event or Permanent Center. Check with your local electronics store or mobile phone provider for rechargeable battery disposal option. Drop off at a designed County Library or Designated Collection site (listed below)

You have two options when it comes to battery recycling in South Africa. You can either sign up to make use of a special battery collection service, or you can drop the batteries off at the various battery recycling centres or ...

If you need to dispose of lithium batteries, look for a local recycling center instead of throwing them in the trash, which can cause a fire. To find a store near you that collects lithium batteries, go to [earth911](#) and search for your area. Alternatively, next time you're shopping, try to stop at a Best Buy, Staples, Lowes, or Home Depot ...

As fire damage resulting from improper handling of lithium-ion batteries has increased in the last few years, so has the need to understand how and why we should take extra care in properly disposing of this specific item.
