What are the four closest planets to the Sun called?

The four closest planets to the Sun are called terrestrial planets. They are often called the Inner Planets as they lie before the asteroid belt of the Solar System. These rocky planets have a solid surface and are mostly made up of silicate rocks and metals. Earth is the largest terrestrial planet in the Solar System.

Which planets were discovered in ancient times?

Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturnwere known in antiquity, and the invention of the telescope added the Asteroid Belt, Uranus, Neptune, Pluto and many of these worlds' moons. The dawn of the space age saw dozens of probes launched to explore our system, an adventure that continues today.

Which planets are called ice giants?

If you were to order the planets by size from smallest to largest they would be Mercury, Mars, Venus, Earth, Neptune, Uranus, Saturn and Jupiter. Jupiter and Saturn are sometimes called the gas giants, whereas the more distant Uranus and Neptune have been nicknamed the ice giants.
