I"ve been getting the message: "Reduced Engine Performance," along with the car going into limp mode. It does not go above about 10-40mph and won"t accelerate reasonably. Clearing the codes with my OBDII scanner once I have the key in position II with the car off temporarily solves the issue.

Hi, My wifes 2004 xc90 diesel has recently had power issues. When driving the car suddenly loses power/acceleration. The message "engine system service urgent" pops up. The car still drives but greatly compromised. However if i stop the car and turn off the ignition the message goes away and drives normally.

Engine system service required I recently had this problem. I noticed that my xc90 warning light came on and the power was greatly compromised, basically un-drivable. I rang volvo and they said bring it in as the car has gone into safe mode restricting power so no damage is caused to the engine, better safe than sorry.

When it detects the DPF needs to be regenerated, (burning off the soot trapped by the filter), the engine management system injects diesel into the exhaust stroke of each cylinder. This burns in the hot exhaust gas, raising temperature of the exhaust to that required for the regeneration process.

Car just popped up a engine system service required. 2005 XC70 Any idea what this is? It's not the maintenance one. ... But I cannot remember ever seeing that caused by oil over filled on a US Volvo. The only system where oil can set codes would the VVT. ... There are only three wires going to the fan two heavy gauge that I guess are power and ...

I bought a brand new 2022 XC90 extended range back in Apr 2022 at Volvo SF. Today I got the check engine on with "propulsion system service required." Tonight I'm getting notification that the car stopped charging. I'm charging it directly into an 110V outlet without any extension and getting these issues.

Welcome to the forum! Sounds like your V40 is giving you a headache with the "engine system service required" message. Since the oil is overfilled and no obvious issues are showing up, it might be related to the DPF. Getting a second opinion from a Volvo specialist could help. Best to avoid driving until you figure it out. Good luck!

No the engine runs ok, but....when the "engine system service" comes on the engine wont rev above 2000rpm whilst in drive and wont pull. But if in neutral it will rev above 2000. If turned off the problem will disapear for another 10-50 miles?

What to Do When You See the Message. If your Volvo displays the "Engine System Service Required" message, it is important not to ignore it. Continuing to drive the vehicle without addressing the underlying issue can potentially cause further damage and lead to expensive repairs.

The wife complained the XC90 was slow pulling out of drive and had no power. Also Engine System Service Required message up. Checked and very slow pulling off with max speed achievable around 75 (Although at one point on the motorway something appeared to happen and allowed full acceleration past 100) although after I slowed down it wouldn't pull again!

Press the remote key into the ignition slot and press START/STOP ENGINE. Ignition mode II Press the



remote key into the ignition slot and press START/STOP ENGINE for approx. 2 seconds. Ignition mode III (engine start) Start the engine 1. Fasten the seat belt. WARNING: Before starting the engine, check that the seat, steering wheel and mirrors ...
