Where can I recycle a battery?

Visit www.Earth911.org or call 1-800-CLEANUP to learn about local battery recycling opportunities. All you need is your zip code. Often called 'flashlight batteries,' alkaline batteries are usually single use batteries in 9 volt, C, D, AA and AAA. Some alkaline batteries are rechargeable.

How do I dispose of a rechargeable battery?

For larger batteries or for large quantities, staff should contact their faculty store or the university hazardous waste contractor directly to arrange disposal. With reducing waste being a high priority, we encourage the purchase and use of rechargeable batteries that can be recharged hundreds of times.

How do you dispose of a leaking battery?

To dispose of leaky batteries, you should first put them in a clear plastic bag and seal it to prevent anyone from coming into direct contact with these hazardous materials. Then you can dispose of the leaking batteries the same as any old batteries - in a battery recycling bin at a supermarket, recycling centre, or via collection.

How do you dispose of a lithium battery?

Disposing of a lithium battery inappropriately may cause fires in landfill if they're thrown away with general waste. They contain valuable materials that can be recycled, recovered, and reused such as cobalt, nickel, copper, and manganese. The best way to dispose of a lithium battery is to return them to the original manufacturer.

Where can I dispose of a freon battery?

For items like refrigerators and air conditioners--which contain Freon-- make an appointment with the Department of Sanitation to have them removed. It's illegal to toss rechargeable batteries of any kind. Instead, you can take them to any store that sells them (like Duane Reade and Home Depot) or an NYC disposal event.

Recycling rechargeable batteries is easier than single-use ones since most recycling centers will readily accept them. They do so because they can be recycled into new products and put back on the market. For instance, when Li-ion batteries are recycled, they result in lithium metal, which can be either resold or used to manufacture sulfur ...

As of 2022, Home Depot was partnering with Call2Recycle, which makes battery recycling at the store possible. If your local Home Depot store doesn't provide a Call2Recycle drop-box, you can always recycle through private companies that often offer cash for your old batteries.
