You must take batteries to an authorized recycling center, a universal waste handler or a household hazardous waste disposal facility. Return lead-acid batteries to a battery retailer or local household hazardous waste collection program; do NOT put lead-acid batteries in the trash or municipal recycling bins. Other Rechargeable Batteries include nickel cadmium, nickel metal hydride, and nickel-zinc batteries. These batteries can be found in cordless power tools, cordless ...

Please follow the guidance on this page and take any batteries for disposal to a hazardous waste collection facility, arrange for a special item pick-up through Seattle Public Utilities, or work with a local battery recycling organization.

Human Toxicity from Damage and Deterioration. Before lithium-ion batteries even reach landfills, they already pose a toxic threat. When damaged, these rechargeable batteries can release fine particles--known as PM10 and PM2.5--into the air. These tiny particles, less than 10 and 2.5 microns in size, are especially dangerous because they carry metals like arsenic, ...

What about automobile batteries? Automobile batteries, also known as lead acid batteries are prohibited from disposal in Georgia landfills. They must be recycled under Georgia law. Check with your local auto dealer, battery retail location, or ...
